

**F.Ili Cigliuti 2013 Barbaresco Serraboella****Neive, Piedmont****Red wine from Italy****Drinking window: 2020 - 2033**

Just bottled, the 2013 Barbaresco Serraboella is quite closed and reticent today. The 2013 boasts a serious center of fruit and tons of intensity, but it is also raw and not fully formed at this stage. Sweet red cherry, rose petal, mint, pomegranate and blood orange open up in the glass, but only with reluctance. The 2013 is deep, powerful and intense, but readers will have to be patient, as the wine is in no mood to show all of its cards today. This is the wine that most deeply shows its recent bottling. The Serraboella spent 26 months in oak, 70% in cask and 30% in 500-liter *tonneaux*.

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This is another super-impressive set of wines from Cigliuti. Over the last few years, the wines have been particularly strong. That is very much the case here. The 2013 Nebbiolos were brought in between October 5 and 15, which is pretty much inline for the vintage. I also had a chance to revisit the 2012s. Those wines are a bit closed today, which is not typical for the year, but likely a very good sign for the future. It would be great to see Cigliuti gain a little more visibility. The wines have been deserving of that for some time.
